- Continue through traffic lights and downhill passing over A500 and railway to next traffic lights
- Turn right into new housing development (Lock 38 former Twyfords factory) and follow road to left Trent and Mersey Canal
- Turn left on to towpath at access by bottle kilns
- Go under a bridge (Shelton New Road) and pass a lock
- Pass second bridge and lock and the junction with the Caldon Canal
- Good access point to Etruria Industrial Museum (café and toilet facilities)

- Leave the towpath by the new Visitor Centre
